Dual Enrollment

Prep Charter's dual enrollment partnerships enable students to begin earning college credit while completing their high school coursework. Through collaborations with the Community College of Philadelphia, Temple University, and the University of Pennsylvania, eligible students take authentic college courses, interact with college faculty, and experience a college campus before receiving a high school diploma. In keeping with Prep Charter's commitment to a tuition-free education, the school covers the cost of college courses and associated fees for students who remain in good academic standing.

The benefits of early college access extend beyond academics. In addition to encountering the rigor of college-level work, students become familiar with how college environments function and learn to take advantage of the resources available at the collegiate level. Research further indicates that dual enrollment participants are more likely to enroll in and complete college degrees than their peers, particularly among first-generation college students.

Community College of Philadelphia (Grade 12)

Prep Charter's longstanding partnership with the Community College of Philadelphia allows twelfth grade students to earn three to six college credits per semester. These courses are scheduled as part of the regular school day, taking the place of corresponding high school classes. Eligibility is based on the College's placement tests as well as demonstrated ability and maturity in grades nine through eleven. Credits earned are recorded on an official college transcript and may be applied toward a degree at the Community College of Philadelphia or transferred to a four-year institution.

Temple University, Fox School of Business (Grade 11)



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Temple's B4USoar program allows eligible eleventh grade students to earn tuition-free, transferable college credit by taking Temple University courses alongside college students. Participants connect with faculty and peer mentors and develop the skills needed for a successful transition to college.

University of Pennsylvania, Penn Arts & Sciences High School Programs (Grade 11)

Penn Arts & Sciences High School Programs provides eligible eleventh grade students with the opportunity to take University of Pennsylvania courses and experience the academic environment of a leading research university. Students may enroll in one course per semester, exploring a range of subjects while challenging themselves academically.

Eleventh grade students who meet program requirements, complete the application process on time, and are accepted following an interview may participate in the Temple and Penn programs.
